## Stratford's grand year

Play 0-1-4 in the lottery if you love Shakespeare. The Stratford Festival of Canada's 2007 season was a triumph for retiring artistic director **Richard Monette**: his 14th season, his 14th surplus.

"I wish my successors (new artistic directors Marti Maraden, Des McAnuff and Don Shipley) fair winds and good fortune on the voyage ahead of them," Monette said.

Attendance -- a healthy chunk of it from Detroit -- rose almost 6%, with a total of 557,813 seats sold to the 14 plays produced. The fest reported net revenue for 2007 of \$221,483 Canadian on total revenue of \$54 million Canadian, thanks to the strong ticket sales and record donations. Revenue from ticket sales was up almost 8%; annual fund-raising increased by 7%.
